Loss of days absence for medical and dental staff (excluding consultants) increased in 2014/15 due to 5 long term sickness cases, four for junior doctors and one for a non-consultant career grade doctor. These alone equated to 567 days. All the staff were managed appropriately according to our HR policies.

For AHPs the Trust has had three long term sick cases for radiographers equating to 270 days.
