




PATIENT INFORMATION

USING YOUR CORNET



Chest physiotherapy helps to clear mucus from your lungs and keep your lungs healthy.

The Cornet is a device that can be used to aid chest clearance by:

- Keeping your airways open as you breathe out
- Providing vibrations in your lungs which help to loosen the mucus

The dial at the top of the Cornet can be adjusted so that you feel the most benefit from it.

How to use your Cornet:

- Wash your hands before you start
- Breathe in slowly
- Hold your breath for a count of 3
- Breathe out steadily through the Cornet. You should feel the vibrations in your chest and hear a noise! Try to keep your cheeks still.
- Repeat thistimes
- After each set, dohuffs (using a tube if you find it easier), and a cough if you feel any mucus on your chest.
- Repeat this forsets

When to use your Cornet:

If you are taking inhaled medication:

You should take	before using your Cornet
You should take	after using your Cornet
Other nebulised medication should be taken	

How often should you use your Cornet:

- When you are well times a day
- When you are showing signs of infection or are unwell,times a day

It is advisable to clean the device after each use.

How to clean your Cornet:

• Disconnect the mouthpiece with the valve hose from the curved tube and insert the drying spatula into the hose.

Important: Throughout the cleaning process, the drying spatula must keep the valve hose open to prevent it from sticking together.



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• All parts may be cleaned in a vaporizer, by means of steam or in boiling water at temperatures between 121°C and 134°C.

Further cleaning possibilities:

RC-Clean cleaning bag

Disassemble the RC-Cornet® as described. Place all parts in the cleaning bag. Further instructions can be found on the RC-Clean cleaning bag

Drying

• During the drying process, the drying spatula is designed to hold the valve tube open to prevent the tube from sticking.

Reassemble when completely dry with the insertion aid.
