Kidderminster Treatment Centre Theatre complex comprises 4 modern laminar flow operating theatres and 2 treatment rooms, a recovery unit and step down recovery. The department provides a 7 day surgical service and has a dedicated team of theatre practitioners and support workers led by a dedicated Management Team and supported by the Clinical Theatre Manager

We are a motivated and progressive department covering a wide range of elective surgical specialities, including Orthopaedics, General, Gynaecology, Breast surgery, ENT, Dental, Urology, Vascular and Pain services covering all aspects of day and short stay elective surgery, for both adult and paediatric patients.

As a registered practitioner in theatre, you will care for patients undergoing a variety of surgical and therapeutic procedures. Your role as perioperative practitioner may include:

- Anaesthetic practitioner
- Scrub practitioner
- Circulating practitioner
- Recovery practitioner
- As a support worker in theatre, you will assist the registered practitioners with perioperative care. As well as ensuring the department is suitably prepared to provide high quality patient care.

All members of staff in theatre receive mandatory Trust training every year and there are a wide range of e-learning modules for all staff to complete and opportunities to complete training to support their individual roles.
