


Breast Unit Patient information leaflet Name of leaflet: Breast cyst

You have been told that you have a breast cyst. A breast cyst is the most common form of a breast lump. A breast cyst is a fluid-filled capsule which forms in the milk-producing tissue of the breast. They are most common in the late 40's and 50's. Most cysts are small and you may not be aware of them, you may have more than one and they may be in both breasts.



A large cyst feels like a rounded lump and may move about easily under the skin when examined. Large cysts can be quite painful, they can occur and increase in size quite rapidly which can be alarming.

Your cyst will have been aspirated in the clinic by inserting a needle into it and draining the fluid into a syringe.

There is no need for any further treatment providing three rules are obeyed;

- The cyst fluid was not bloody.
- There is no lump still remaining after the fluid has been drained.
- The same cyst does not keep recurring.

Please examine yourself once a month, especially over the next few months to make sure the same cyst has not returned.

Now that you have had a breast cyst there is a 40% chance that you may develop another within 2 years. However, there is no evidence to suggest that a history of breast cysts leads to an increased risk of developing cancer later.

It is important to remember that one in nine women will develop breast cancer. Therefore breast awareness and breast self-examination are important in the early detection of breast cancer.
